About 18 months ago I attended a live music show; after only 10 minutes at the show I had ringing in my ears, and even a pain sensation when hearing loud noises (I almost missed hearing an ambulance because I was holding my shoulder up to my ear, it bothered me that much). I went to a hearing specialist; the MD said I have very sensitive ears, reverberant rooms (“acoustically live”) are what bothers me the most. I didn’t actually lose any hearing ability according to testing. I contacted Acoustical Surfaces Inc., and Ted suggested using Echo Eliminator Acoustical Ceiling Tiles on the ceiling. The cotton on the ceiling took the reverberation out of that room where my audio/TV system and keyboard are. It felt much nicer to my ears. The odd/telling experience was when it was half-way up, a person could snap their fingers under the cotton vs. under the bare ceiling: like when you’d have your head next to those sound-absorbing public telephone kiosks in airports, years ago. You can just hear the original snap. I have

hardwood floors and no curtains. Amazingly – wonderfully – the pain sensation in my ears, caused by noise, went away in about 8 weeks after getting the Echo Eliminator Acoustical Ceiling Tiles up! There wasn't any control sample, but I can attest it made the room *much* nicer for me. I noticed that voices were noticeably easier to understand, and they came more obviously directionally from the center channel speaker, listening to DVD's.

In this installation, 1" thick, #3 lb. density Echo Eliminator panels in white were used. We cut these panels as straight as possible. With installations like the one pictured here, one can expect a certain amount of "quilting" or visible edges of the panels.
